# **We Celebrate At The Table of Christ**

#### Welcome to the Table

One: Here we participate in a sacred story. Here we celebrate the feast of the resurrection. Here we remember Jesus, crucified and risen –a Spirit filled life that moves us to awe and wonder. In Christ, God desires all find a welcome here. Yet we are reminded that as we gather, we also prepare ourselves for the giving. With humble hearts, let us turn again to the forgiveness that comes from God.

### **Litany Of Discernment**

One: Loving and caring God, may our hearts and minds be open to you. Look not upon our brokenness but upon our faith. Remove the barriers between us and your love.

All: Make us hungry for justice with mercy and for peace with compassion.

## \*Exchange of the Peace

The peace of Christ be with you... And also with you.



In Judaism Pentecost was the feast which occurred fifty days after Passover. Known as the Festival of Weeks, it celebrated the many gifts of God. Pentecost celebrates the arrival of another gift. That of the Holy Spirit. Just as Passover marks the liberation of God's people from the slavery of Egypt, so Pentecost celebrates the liberation of Jesus' disciples to begin the mission of the Church.

The followers of Jesus move from being "disciples" (students) to becoming "apostles" (sent ones). The apostles received "the power from on high," and they began to preach and bear witness to the power of Jesus as the risen Christ, the Lord. This moment has traditionally been called the birthday of the Church.
